# Highlights on the Renon

## **The Renon – where “Sommerfrische” (summer-resort in a cooler atmosphere) was discovered**

The first “Frischler” (summer holiday makers of this kind) went up the Renon, Bolzano’s local mountain, as early as 1505. Every year since then at the beginning of summer the custom has been to go up the Renon for “Frisch”-holiday. The traditional summer holiday lasted exactly 72 days. On 29<sup>th</sup> June, St. Peter and St. Paul’s day, the personal belongings and sufficient linen of the wealthy families of Bolzano were packed in trunks and boxes, the children put in panniers made from plaited rods and together with the lady of the house, usually sitting side saddle on her steed, made their way up into the airy heights of the Renon.

Already in the “Eight Beatitudes of Bolzano”, the rules of procedure that set the tone for every true citizen of Bolzano, Karl Theodor Hoeningner wrote in the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century: “The third absolutely essential beatitude is to have a holiday home in breezy, uncongested Renon”.

## **The narrow-gauge railway – a rarity in the world**

The Renon railway was opened on 13<sup>th</sup> August 1907. For the first time it was possible to cover the just under 1.000 m difference in altitude from Bolzano up to the Renon effortlessly. Quick, reliable and not subject to changes in weather the modern railway carried not only passengers but also goods up to the Renon. Up until the 1960s the rack and pinion railway was the lifeline

of the Renon. Today all year round it joins up the localities of Soprabolzano, Costalovara, Stella Renon and Collalbo. In order to cope with the requirements of the “Südtirol Takt” (regular-interval timetable), the rolling stock has been extended. The course is set for the future.

The Renon railway is one of South Tyrol’s treasures. It is an important public means of transport, a sought-after excursion railway and a technical railway rarity passengers have become fond of and that will also bring a lot of pleasure in the future to those who have taken it to their hearts.

## **The Corno del Renon – the most beautiful viewpoint mountain of the Dolomites, UNESCO’s world natural heritage**

At the beginning of the 20<sup>th</sup> century the famous mountaineer, Ludwig Purtscheller, enthused: “Whoever wants to take in Tyrol with one glance should climb these mountains.” He was right for on clear days visitors have an unbelievably beautiful panoramic view: from the giant glaciers of the Ortles and the Ötztaler Alps in the west to the legendary world of the Dolomites far in the east; from the Stubai and Zillertal Alps in the north to the Presenella, to the Adamello and the Brenta Dolomites in the south. The Corno del Renon makes for an ideal excursion at any time of the year. Here you can go for a gentle walk or on more demanding and challenging hikes. The Corno del Renon is ideal for family skiing in winter. A modern cable car makes the ascent easier. The



peak is just about an hour away and nearly 200 metres in altitude difference from the mountain station of the Cima Lago Nero.

### **Earth Pyramids – a wonder of nature**

The Renon Earth Pyramids are the highest and the most aesthetically pleasing in Europe. Earth Pyramids are a phenomenon of erosion. They originate there where ice-age glaciers have deposited moraine clay in valleys. When it is dry it is rock-hard. If it comes into contact with water, it turns into a clayey pulp that flows down into the valley. However, when protected from the rain by large stones, the clay remains dry and hard. Only the part around the stone erodes. This is how earth columns are formed and become higher each time it rains. If the top stone falls off the peak, the column

is certainly doomed to a quick decline because the clay is exposed to the rain and then carried away by it. The earth pyramids on the Renon can be marvelled at in three ravines: in the rio Fosco valley between Longomoso and S. Maria, in the Rio Rivellone valley below Soprabolzano and in the valley of the Rio Gasterer at Auna di Sotto.

### **The Plattner apiculture farm house – a monument of rural savoir vivre**

The Plattner farm house in Costalovara is more than 600 years old. The Gramm Family, a mercantile family from Bolzano, has carried out an exemplary restoration of it liaising closely with the provincial historic preservation agency and so, also because of its unique location, it is one of the most picturesque farmsteads in the region. Today

it accommodates a bee-keeping museum that illustrates in a lively and vivid way the sweet art of making honey. The magnificent Plattnerhof is on the one hand the largest private collection of South Tyrol's beekeeping, at the same time it is also a monument of rural architecture and savoir vivre. A nature trail on the picturesque hill near to the house explains the world of bees to visitors.

### **Longomoso commandery – a cultural centre steeped in tradition**

When the first mountain hostels were established in the 12<sup>th</sup> century in the "land of mountains", one was set up also in Longomoso. Travellers, who had to travel over the Renon because the Eisack gorge was not yet passable, had to find accommodation and a place to eat. In the 14<sup>th</sup> century, the main

route of the Brenner line was moved into the valley and consequently the hostel became less important, and it became a commandery of the Teutonic Order. The commandery building owes its current design to the provincial commander, Georg Niklas Vintler von Platsch. Since 1989 the board of trustees of the commandery Longomoso has catered for the regular opening of the baroque staterooms and organised concerts and exhibitions there from May to October. In this way, the whole complex became a cultural centre with a reputation and attraction far beyond the Renon. From mid-July to mid-August, the picturesque inner courtyard of the commandery becomes the scene of the oldest open-air theatre in South Tyrol – "Rittner Sommerspiele" (Renon summer plays).



# Highlights in South Tyrol

## South Tyrol – uniquely beautiful

Hardly any holiday area is as interesting and diverse as South Tyrol. Where else can you get so close to the German and Italian cultures? Where else can you hike in the high mountains and then sit under palm trees on the same day of your holiday?

## Bolzano – famous for its arcades

You can easily get to South Tyrol's capital from the Renon on the Renon cable car. It runs every four minutes from Soprabolzano and floats down in only twelve minutes to Bolzano. From the valley station, it only takes you ten minutes on foot to get to Bolzano's most desirable address, Piazza Walther.

The mighty cathedral, "Santa Maria Assunta" rises up in front of it. The Domenicani, Capuccini and Francescani churches, also located in the old town, are well worth seeing. The arcades are at the centre of the town, as well as the boutiques, next to each other, the fruit and vegetable market, steeped in tradition, and of course the delicatessens, for which Bolzano is well-known beyond its boundaries, invite you to saunter and shop at any time of the year.

## The Gardens of Trauttmansdorff Castle – uniquely marvelous

They inspire visitors with their exceptional diversity and are South Tyrol's most popular destination for an excursion. On the eastern outskirts of

Merano, you will find an area of twelve hectares over 80 colourful horticultural landscapes from all over the world. The gardens offer a variety of sensory experiences that will stay in your memory for a long time. Special botanical attractions and artist pavilions that process botanical themes originally make a visit an unforgettable experience. Trauttmansdorff Castle sits regally amid the gardens that in its history, alternating between fame and decay, attained great importance, especially from the visits of Empress "Sissi" Elisabeth of Austria.

## Lake Caldaro – a holiday paradise for young and old

Lake Caldaro is the warmest bathing lake in the Alps. The wine of the same name thrives on its banks. It comes mainly from the Vernatsch grape. The Ruins of Castelchiaro look down over the lake. Rare species of birds have their refuge on the southern bank. Cypresses, laurel and olive trees contribute to the Mediterranean atmosphere just as Lake Caldaro's lido, a building of elaborate architecture opened in 2006. Families with children find a little paradise here and can spend a wonderful holiday with a lot of fun: bathing, rowing, surfing and sailing.



### **Alpe di Siusi – queen of all mountain pastures**

The Alpe di Siusi spans an area of more than 56 square kilometres. Its lowest point is 1.850 m above sea level and its highest 2.350 m. For this reason it is the largest mountain pasture in Europe and is one of the continent's best-known hiking and winter sports areas. Numerous mountain cabins, in which tasty typical regional dishes are served, invite you to have a comfortable break. The rich flora with its many rare species is in full blossom between mid-June and July. Then it is really especially beautiful on the Alpe di Siusi. It is certainly well worth a visit at any time of the year. That's a promise!

The Alpe di Siusi cable car is not included in the RittenCard.

### **Bletterbachschlucht (ravine) – a journey into primeval times**

Whoever wants to see an impressive canyon does not need to fly abroad. The Geoparc Bletterbachschlucht to the south of Bolzano is an adventure park, a learning location and natural monument all in one. Geological treasures and various forms of landscape make it possible to understand the development of earth and its people over millions of years from unusual perspectives. The ravine is the result of weathering and erosion. Since the last ice age, somewhat more than 15.000 years ago, the Bletterbach has dug itself into the mountain for a distance of eight kilometres to a depth of 400 m.

Approximately ten billion tons of rocks were carried away and swept into the Adige valley. In this way,

layer upon layer was laid bare – and today this allows us an awe-inspiring insight into the interior of the mountains.

Your RittenCard includes a visit to the Geomuseum in Redagno! Admission to the Geoparc Bletterbach is not included.

### **Lago di Carezza – fabulous nature**

Lago di Carezza is located in the municipal area of Nova Levante at an altitude of 1.520 m above sea level and is fed from the Latemar mountain range by underground springs. This mountain lake is famous for its deep green iridescent water and its beautiful backdrop with the Catinaccio and Latemar groups rising in the background. The lake abounds with many South Tyrolean legends and myths.

Writers and painters chose this motif for tales and paintings. But the area between the Catinaccio and the Latemar is worth a visit not only because of the lake. Situated at the south west gateway to the Dolomite Mountains, it spans more than 250 square kilometres. Nestling in meadow hillsides and coniferous woodland, it is bordered to the north by the Sciliar. The imposing Catinaccio group, connected to the Latemar by Passo Costalunga – the border between South Tyrol and the province of Trentino, is alongside it. In 2009, the Dolomite Mountains were included in the list of UNESCO's world natural heritage because of their "unique monumental beauty" – in the words of the committee.





## Get mobile with the RittenCard

With the RittenCard you can travel comfortably throughout South Tyrol and, in doing so, discover its scenery, culture and museums. The RittenCard is your ticket for all public transport.

This includes:

- **All local trains in South Tyrol from Brennero to Trento, as well as from Malles to San Candido inclusive of the Val Venosta railway and the Pusteria valley railway.**
- **The PostBus Switzerland between Mals and Müstair**
- **All urban buses, intercity and city buses**
- **The cable cars of Renon, Maranza, San Genesio, Meltina and Verano**
- **The Renon narrow-gauge railway**
- **The funicular to the Mendola**

### **Renon narrow-gauge railway**

The Renon railway was inaugurated on 13<sup>th</sup> August 1907. It was the period of the belle époque, when the intention was to make the mountains accessible to the wealthy for relaxation. The narrow-gauge railway ran from Bolzano direct to the Renon. In the process it covered the just under 1.000 m in altitude. It was replaced in 1966 by a cable railway. The narrow-gauge railway, however, has been maintained on the high plateau. This railway technical rarity still links the localities of Soprabolzano, Costalovara, Stella Renon and Collalbo – and this all year round at half hourly intervals.

It takes 16 minutes to reach Collalbo from Soprabolzano

### **Renon cable car**

The cable car that replaced the funicular from Bolzano to Renon in 1966 has also meanwhile become history. For since 2009 Bolzano and Soprabolzano are only 4 minutes apart by the new cable car. The spacious cabins offer space for 30 passengers, bikes and prams.

Travelling time: 12 minutes

### **Mendola railway**

The Mendola railway started operations on 19<sup>th</sup> October 1903 in S. Antonio near Caldaro. It runs from S. Antonio near Caldaro up to the Passo Mendola. In the process it copes with a difference in altitude of 850 m over a distance of 4.5 kilometres and a gradient of 64%. To date it is one of the steepest, longest and most spectacular funiculars of Europe.

Travelling time: 12 minutes

### **The Vinschgerbahn**

The Vinschgerbahn travels from Merano to Mals - originally planned as part of the transalpine. After 15 years of planning and construction it was opened in 1906 on July 1 and brought prosperity and progress into the valley. In summer 1990 she was decommissioned. In 2005 on May 5 opened the Vinschgerbahn again - today it is a popular mode of transportation and excursion train. Leave your bike at home, the Vinschgerbahn offers in cooperation with "Südtirol Rad" a solution for a perfect day bike-trip. It's easy to plan your trip, as there are many different bike-rental stations along the track. More information [www.suedtirol-rad.com](http://www.suedtirol-rad.com)

## Are museums boring? Not in South Tyrol!


They look down gracefully over valleys, they bask in the sun on pleasant heights, they rise defiantly amongst vineyards, they stick to craggy rocks, they radiate in Baroque splendour, they stand guard on impassable hillsides and they repose in divine tranquillity. You can find them everywhere throughout the whole province. They number more than 800 castles and stately homes, monasteries and museums. That makes South Tyrol Europe's region with the highest number of castles and that is not by chance. After all since its early settlements, South Tyrol has been a country that people have passed through and has been influenced by several cultures.

As early as the 5<sup>th</sup> century BC, the Celts travelled across the country. The cultural history then began long before

the time of the Romans, who only came to the province in about 25 BC. As the region was located on the old Claudia Augusta road that led via Merano to Passo Resia as well as on the imperial road over the Brennero, many castles gained an important strategic meaning. Over the years, some of them have fallen into ruin, but many are still very well preserved and today accommodate museums with interesting collections and special exhibitions. By the way, many museums are not only fascinating for adults, but are also an adventure for children. With your RittenCard you can embark on a journey of discovery to visit all the castles and stately homes, monasteries and museums mentioned here and for which you do not need to pay admission if you have the RittenCard. Your holiday should not be too short though!

We would like to recommend these especially warmly to you:

- Castel Tirolo near Merano, the family seat of the Count of Tyrol, today accommodates the provincial museum for culture and provincial history.
- Messner Mountain Museum (MMM) Firmiano in the late mediaeval annex of Castel Firmaiano near Bolzano. The topic of MMM Firmiano is the history and art of mountaineering. Easy to reach from the train station Bolzano, leave the train to Merano at Sigmundskron, a walk of about 35 minutes takes you to the castle.
- The Apiculture Museum in the 600-year old Plattner Bienenhof on the Renon. Here you can get to know everything about life in a beehive, the production of honey and gain an insight into the lives of mountain farmers over the past centuries.
- The South Tyrol Museum of Archaeology in Bolzano informs you about the history of the province from the Old Stone Age (15.000 BC) to the Carolingian period, Charlemagne (about 800 AD). A whole level is devoted to the Iceman "Ötzi".
- On Runkelstein Castle is the largest original secular frescoes in the world. Therefore the Runkelstein Castle is also called the castle of images castle. Perched on a porphyry rock the mighty Runkelstein Castle towers above the city of Bolzano. Accessible by city bus from Bolzano train station or the Zollstange station near the valley station of the Renon Cable Car.

## Castles & palaces / monasteries / museums



### 1 Museum Monastery of Marienberg



Since 2007 a museum has been accommodated in the ground floor of the domestic wing of the Benedictine Abbey. It provides visitors a contemporary insight into everyday life behind the Monastery walls.

#### Opening hours:

March 15 - October 31:

Mon. - Sat., 10 - 17

December 27 - January 5:

Mon. - Sat., 10 - 17

Closed on church holidays and Sunday, except Easter Monday and With Monday

## Terms and conditions of business

**The terms and conditions below are expressly agreed for issue and use of the RittenCard.**

#### Definition

All rightful holders of the RittenCard are entitled to use the services of its partner establishments without additional cost, Bonus partners and stops for refreshments excluded. The RittenCard allows all in our holiday region in accommodation (member companies of the tourist office Renon) registered persons the use of the designated services of the RittenCard.

The services are specified and listed in the brochure "Experience the sunny plateau with RittenCard". Beyond these services, there are discounts (bonus services) that are also listed in the brochure.

#### Scope/Exclusion of liability

All RittenCard partners listed in the brochure undertake to make all the services listed available to RittenCard holders, according to and taking into account their own terms and conditions of business and transportation, at their usual business hours and to the full extent in terms of time, quantity and quality. Holders of the RittenCard acknowledge that the operating hours of some partners may change, particularly on account of circumstan-

ces arising from weather and seasonal conditions. Waiting times of different lengths may occur especially during peak periods.

RittenCard holders accept the opening hours indicated as well as any limitations of access and capacity information provided by the RittenCard partners. They waive all and any claims for damages should any service be rendered only in part or not at all due to operating conditions or circumstances beyond the service provider's control.

In addition, service providers shall be liable only in cases of gross negligence and intent but not in cases of ordinary negligence. Beyond this, service providers are not liable for any equipment, clothing or other valuables of card holders. Holders of the RittenCard further acknowledge that the Altipiano del Renon soc. Consortile a.r.l., hereinafter referred to as just Renon s.c.a.r.l., is entitled to terminate its agreement with individual service providers for significant reasons even during the season, and that no claims of any kind arising from this circumstance shall be accepted.

#### Requirements for issue of the RittenCard

All RittenCard partner establishments undertake to draw the guests' attention to the RittenCard regardless of the length of their stay. Guests spending the

night at a RittenCard partner establishment will receive, from their host, a RittenCard for the duration of their stay. It is a requirement for issue of the RittenCard that guests are registered by their host upon arrival in conformity with the Italian laws of registration.

### Non-transferability/loss of card

The RittenCard is not transferable. No refund is given if the card is not used. In case the card is lost, it will not be replaced.

### Validity

The RittenCard is valid for 7 days from the moment of first use.

### Prices

The RittenCard is not for sale. Only guests staying in a RittenCard partner establishment and registered by their host according to Italian law are entitled to obtain the card.

### Children

Children 6 years and older get their own RittenCard Junior.

### How to use the card

Card holders wishing to benefit from the inclusive services show their RittenCard to the respective service provider. The service provider checks the validity of the card by scanning it, or by performing a mere visual examination and noting down the card number.

### Damage

If the RittenCard is damaged or defective, it is replaced free of charge by the host establishment.

### Misuse

In case of misuse or suspected misuse, RittenCard service partners are entitled and

obliged to withdraw the card without replacement, and to file a report with the police. Card holders are liable for misuse of the card by third parties. In the event of theft or loss of the card, card holders are required to report the incident promptly to the Renon Tourism Association under 0471 356 100. There is no legal claim to a substitute card.

### Exclusion of liability of the Renon s.c.a.r.l.

Holders of the RittenCard acknowledge that the Renon s.c.a.r.l. acts only as an intermediary between RittenCard holders and the service providers/partner establishments. RittenCard holders waive all and any claims for warranty or damages, regardless of whether the service provider/partner establishment is to blame for any damage or not. It is explicitly noted that in the case of a liability claim, the Renon s.c.a.r.l. shall not be held liable, in particular as neither the service providers nor the partner establishments are accessories of the Renon s.c.a.r.l. Moreover, RittenCard holders are not entitled to indemnification from the Renon s.c.a.r.l. in the event that a partner establishment or service provider fails to provide any of the services indicated in the brochure.

### Place of jurisdiction, applicable law

For any litigation arising from the use of the RittenCard including claims for damages and warranty, Renon shall be the only place of jurisdiction and Italian law shall be the only applicable law.
